FUSION (Fun Unite Smile Ignite Older New) An Aged and Youth Partnership



The FUSION program is all about connecting secondary school students with the residents and family members at SummitCare, the program teaches the students how to comfortably connect with older people and show appreciation for different cultures, learn new life skills, and most importantly have fun.

Ampha Mammone, Head of Strategic Development at SWC commented 'FUSION encourages, supports and increases participation in volunteering at an early age. It enhances their employability skills and will assist interested students in making the transition from school to work in the community sector. This will help with the skills shortages in the aged care sector in line with Australia's aging population as well as combating the high youth unemployment in this region.' She goes on to say,' this would not have been possible without the fantastic team at Canley Vale.'

The students visit SummitCare once every two weeks for the afternoon. There is buddy system that has been thoughtfully worked through – looking at language and culture, abilities and interests. The sessions are organised by Susan Miller-Bere, Leisure and Lifestyle Officer and Maree Midena, Careers Advisor at Canley Vale High School.

Canley Vale High School student, Thao said FUSION allowed her to know how to relate with aged residents and gained an insight into the importance of supporting our aging population "we've been exposed to many jobs available in this industry and developed skills that will be useful now and in the future".

Cynthia Payne, SummitCare's CEO says, 'SummitCare is extremely proud and thankful to SWC and Canley Vale High School to have been involved in this pilot. The dedicated team at Canley Vale have made a huge success of a program that not only enriches the resident's lives but also really harnesses the importance of community and a sense of worth.'

Now in its third year the program is so successful that students are being required to submit an expression of interest to take part. The 2015/16 FU-SION program at Canley Vale received funding from Clubs NSW, Fairfield RSL and St Johns Park Bowling Club. This meaningful program will be replicated at two SummitCare sites in Liverpool and Smithfield concurrently in 2016/17 thanks to the generous ClubGRANTS contribution of the Mounties Group.

At the conclusion of the project, participants will have donated 2,000 hours of volunteering time.

- Improving community connectedness and social inclusion
