We are still quite new to the Workplacement Program, we hosted 2 students as a favour to a teacher friend of mine in 2018 and enjoyed the experience. After speaking with Harley we agreed to host students on a weekly basis for 2019. So far it is going great. We have had some exceptional students come through the doors.

The program gives me a chance to develop my staff’s communication and management skills by buddying up a student with a staff member. It is also a chance for me to ensure our safety protocols are being taught properly during the induction.

I am proud of my industry and what we do as an organisation. I want to share my passion for my job and hopefully inspire others to follow theirs as well.

It is a great opportunity for the students to try an area of the construction industry before making a fulltime commitment – by getting an apprenticeship.

We get to share some of our knowledge with hopefully the next generation of tradesmen, and encourage the students with a ‘can do’ as opposed to can’t do attitude even though they are only with us for 5 days.

With so many electronic distractions we are losing that human connection to talk, and work side by side on a project, to assist each other with problems that come up along the way, and to teach and learn from each other. Learning these skills, those transferable skills, the life skills are just as important as learning the trade based skills for the students.

The diversity of my job keeps me going, I never know what the next phone call will be a request for – we have had a chance to design and construct some amazing pieces for our clients.

The passion I have for the work I do extends to the client and our staff so everyone is excited and stimulated for the next challenge I present to them. I think the variety of work keeps all the
