HOW VET FITS INTO YOUR HSC

- VET courses count towards your HSC just like other subjects.
- Some courses can even contribute to your ATAR if you sit the optional exam.
- You can balance VET with your other school subjects it's not "either/or."

- **Skills employers want –** cooking, building, IT, health, business, and more.
- Work experience put your learning into action during work placement.
- **Confidence** step out of school knowing you've already worked in the industry.
- **Options** pathway into work, TAFE, uni, or apprenticeships.















THE BENEFITS OF VET FOR YOU

As part of your VET course, you'll do **mandatory** work placement. That means:

- · Working in real kitchens if you study Hospitality
- On site if you choose Construction or trades
- In offices or businesses if you study IT or Business Services
- In aged care or childcare centres if you choose *Health/Community*
- In retail stores if you study Retail Services.



Work placement gives you a taste of the real job — and helps you decide if it's the right path for you.

Work placement is a compulsory component of your VET course. You will not be paid while on work placement.

WORK PLACEMENT = REAL EXPERIENCE

- ✓ **Earn While You Learn** Start working part-time in your chosen field while still at school.
- ✓ Finish School with More Graduate with your HSC and a qualification.
- ✓ **Get Ahead** VET-trained students often move straight into apprenticeships, traineeships, or work.
- ✓ Uni Still an Option If you sit the optional exam, some VET subjects count towards your ATAR.
- ✓ **Learn** work ethics, team work, generic skills and the meaning of responsibility
